6-17-17 Invitational Rifle Match

CMP Vintage Sniper Team Match

Also: Modern (Custom/Open/Service Rifle) Team Sniper Match

Date: June 17th, 2017. Sign-up will commence at ~ 1300 (1pm) at the 300-yd. line, upon completion of the GSM match.

Fee: \$10 each competitor (\$20 per team)

Entry: entry is open to all established high power rifle competitors. No advanced entry required.

Rules: CMP rules will apply.

Equipment: Only CMP Vintage Sniper Rifles allowed for the CMP category. See the CMP rules at thecmp.com (See CMP rulebook 15, pgs. 63, 64, 81, 82, 83 et al.)

All others will be firing “*out-of-competition*” with regard to the CMP Vintage Sniper Rifle Team category. Service Rifles, Vintage Rifles, Custom & “Other” rifles allowed for “out of competition” participants (Max. cal. of .338) Only safe ammo is allowed.

A front bag without channel is allowed. The 1907 leather sling, the M-1 web or “as-issue” sling is allowed. Other CMP/NRA High Power equipment such as coats, mats, scopes, etc. allowed.

Targets: the SR-3 and MR-1 targets will be fired at from 300 and 600 yards, respectively. Those competitors firing out of CMP competition using match conditioned, modern and or F class equipment shall fire on the F-class or other reduced and compensated targets.

Course of fire: (The CMP Vintage Sniper Match) each team member will fire 10 rounds for record from the 300-yard range and 10 rounds for record from the 600-yard range, for a total of 20 shots *each and 40 shots* per team.

Each *team* will have a 3-minute preparation period and a 5-minute sighting period with unlimited sighting shots at the 300 and 600 yard ranges. There will be a 20 second exposure of the target allowed for each record shot, with the target in the pit for scoring and marking for 20 seconds, for each shot. All targets will be operated in unison, with 20 seconds available for each shot and 20 seconds in the pit, etc. until 10 cycles have been completed for each team member at both the 300 and 600 yard distances. There will be a 2-minute change over time period allowed for the second team member to get into the firing position. Score keepers will or will not call out shot value, per shooting team request. Competitors will shoot, score and do pit duties.

Awards: CMP award pins to members of CMP shooting teams achieving appropriate cut scores. If six or more teams compete in a category (CMP or Modern) an engraved plaque shall be awarded to the members of the winning team of that category.

Competitors will shoot, score and perform pit and other duties as assigned.

Eye and hearing protection is mandatory for all competitors while firing is ongoing.

A brimmed hat, eye and hearing protection is also required in the pits, while firing is ongoing.

Use of empty chamber indicator (ECI) is required.
